OVERVIEW

When people think of vision statements, there are usually two related but different things they picture. One is a vision statement, and one is a mission statement. These ideals are related and most organizations/churches end up combining them, but for the purpose of my conversation with you today, we'll treat them separately.

DIFFERENCES Of The TWO

VISION: A vision statement describes how God sees the organization and instructs the Leader to carry it out. Vision focuses on the personality or make-up of the organization.

MISSION: A mission statement describes what actions will result from your vision.
