#### **Minutes June 1950**



- Mrs. Fegan of the Southwest Missouri Conference stated on the advice of President Dudley of the Connectional Organization the name Laymen's League should be changed to Laymen's Organization.
- Attorney Dudley's profound and prolific tenure leadership resulted in the Lay movement expanding into all Episcopal Districts and Annual Conference Organizations.

- Fifth District Historiographer Book
- Completing all of the Transcribing of the Colored Conventions held in AME Churches in 5<sup>th</sup> District:
- Thirty-five years before the abolition of slavery, visionary American prophet Bishop Richard Allen hosted a national gathering of Black men and women at Mother Bethel, Philadelphia.
  At this, the first Colored Convention 1830, delegates from African American communities gathered, elections were held, committees appointed and official conversations about the African-American response to racial crises of the day were held. At the conclusion of the meeting, resolutions were passed and a statement of understanding presented by the president of the convention Bishop Richard Allen, copies of which were issued and made available to the public
